Winsome Windchimes

A. Heart & Beaded Windchime

Total Time: 1 hour

Requires Adult Supervision

Materials:

- Drill
- Wooden base shape
- Paint
- Ribbon
- Chimes
- Beads
- Fish-wire
- Super-glue (optional)
- Sealant for wood (optional)

Instructions:

- 1. Paint both sides of the wooden base shape
- 2. Drill two holes in the base shape at the top and seven holes at the bottom
- 3. Thread fish wire through holes in base- tie a knot.
- 4. Thread the fish-wire through the holes in the chimes and beads
- 5. Tie a big knot that won't let the beads and chimes fall off the string- chimes should be alternating lengths
- 6. Middle chime should be lower than the surrounding chimes
- 7. Thread ribbon through the two holes at the top
- 8. Leave enough space to hang the chime and secure in a bow- superglue the bow so it doesn't unravel



B. Seashell Windchime

Total Time: 1 hour

Requires Adult Supervision

Materials:

- Starfish
- Sea glass
- Seashells
- Fish wire
- Drill

Instructions:

- 1. Use a small drill bit and drill through the starfish, shells, and sea glass
- 2. Cut 6 lines- one longer than the others for middle line
- 3. String the hanging items- alternate big and small pieces
- 4. String middle line with just sea glass
- 5. Knot the fishing line- make sure it's big enough that it can't be pulled through the hole
- 6. Repeat for each piece of shell/glass that you want to add to the line
- 7. Secure to the starfish, thread up through the bottom of the starfish and tie another knot.
- 8. Thread middle line through the bottom of the starfish and secure in place with several knots above the starfish.
- 9. Create a loop at the top, feed it back through the starfish and secure with several knots at the bottom of the starfish.



C. Macrame Windchime

Total Time: 1 hour

Materials:

- Yarn
- Chimes
- 3-inch gold macrame rings
- 1.5-inch gold macrame ring
- Fishing line
- Gold split rings
- Scissors
- Super glue
- Masking or washi tape

Instructions:

- 1. Measure and cut eight 115-inch (9 feet 7 inch) pieces of yarn, one 5-foot piece, and one 2.5-foot piece
- Line up the eight long pieces, find the center, and fold in half so you will have 16 pieces of yarn to knot. Tape a couple inches from the top to create a loop. Set the two remaining pieces of yarn aside.
- 3. Divide the yarn into four sets of four, and start knotting- some patterns could be square knot and/or half square knot spiral
- 4. Add the 3-inch rings to pull the strands apart, using a Square Knot- used a little super glue to keep the strands in place
- 5. When finished knotting, tie strands with a knot and cut off the excess string
- 6. Attach your chimes to the split rings, and put them on the macrame ring
- 7. Tie the small macrame ring on fishing line and attach to the loop at the top of hanger, make sure it's long enough for the ring to hit the chimes
